#### **RSV Vaccine**

The RSV vaccine helps protect against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), a common virus that can make babies and older adults seriously ill.

The vaccine is recommended if:

- you're pregnant—the vaccine is recommended during every pregnancy (from 28 weeks onwards) to help protect your baby after they are born
- you're aged 75 to 79

If you turned 80 after 1st September 2024, you're eligible for the RSV vaccine until 31st August 2025.

You are not eligible for the vaccine if you turned 80 on or before 1st September 2024.

## **Shingles Vaccine**

The shingles vaccine helps protect against shingles. It's a common condition that causes a painful rash.

It's recommended for all adults:

- turning 65 on or after 1st September 2023,
- those aged 70 to 79
- those aged 50 and over with a severely weakened immune system.

## **Prescribing for Hay fever**

Hertfordshire and West Essex Integrated Care Board (HWE ICB) do not routinely support the prescribing of medicines that are available to buy over the counter from pharmacies and other outlets. All individuals will be expected to pay for over the counter medicines for conditions that can be manged through self-care. This does include groups that currently receive free prescriptions.

## **Car Park Changes at Kings Langley**
